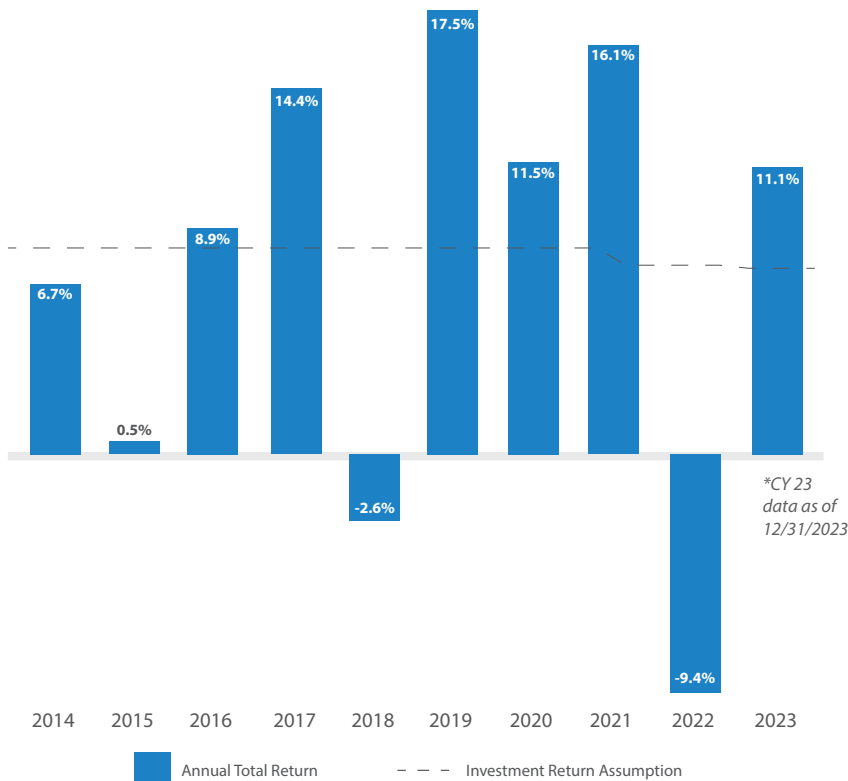

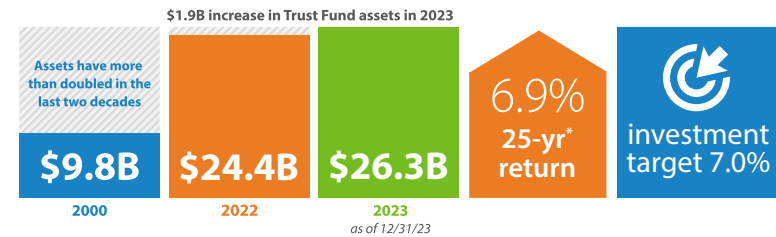

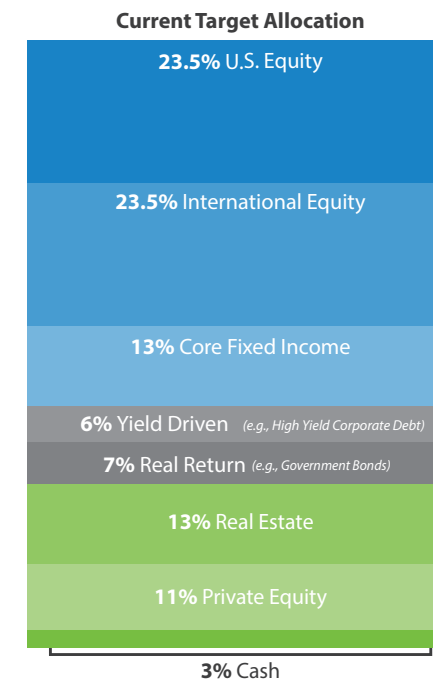


Growing Assets



Well Diversified for the Long-Term

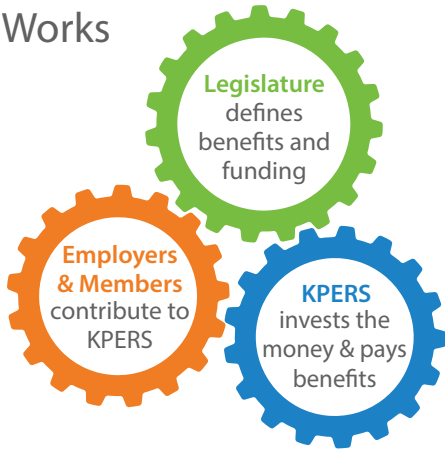
100% of KPERS' U.S. equity is in "passive" investments. Passive investing is a low-cost way to gain market exposure.

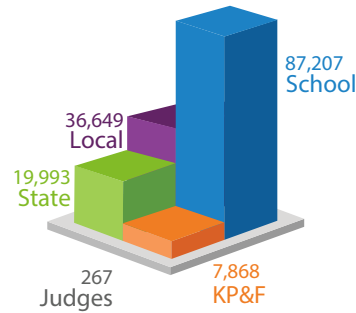
The Kansas Public Employees Retirement System serves members at state, school and local employers, providing retirement, disability and survivor benefits to members and their beneficiaries.
